UPCOMING MEETINGS

N.A.T.C.A PRESIDENT'S AWARD 2019: ANDREW RICE, RYAN SCHILE, ORD Dec 18, 2019

On March 1, 2019, after noon CST, Chicago-O'Hare (ORD) certified professional controller (CPC) Ryan Schile was working third local control and was departing aircraft off of Runway 10-Left at intersection DD. Schile was also working the arrivals that were landing on 10-Right and 10-Center. He worked them back across the runway he was departing to the terminal area.

"Needless to say, he was a little busy," NATCA President Paul Rinaldi said in introducing the story to the Archie League Medal of Safety Awards banquet on Sept. 18 at Communicating For Safety.

Schile issued a departure clearance to an Envoy Air twin-jet ERJ-145, with an initial heading of 100 and a takeoff clearance. This heading paralleled the departure runways and the arrival runways so there would be no conflict. The pilot of the ERJ-145 read back the correct heading and began takeoff roll.

Once airborne, for an unknown reason, the ERJ-145 began a hard-left turn, placing that aircraft in a collision course with an American Airlines Boeing 737-800, which was departing Runway 9-Right. Schile quickly recognized the potential for a collision and instructed the ERJ-145 to stop his climb immediately.

Subsequently, Schile issued an immediate turn to the right to a heading of 140.

Working on the other side of the airport was fellow ORD CPC Andrew Rice, who was working the American 737. He also observed the impending collision and issued the aircraft an immediate left-hand turn and a 070 heading. Seeing that was not enough, he instructed the aircraft to continue its left-hand turn on a 360 heading to pull these aircraft apart.

The Federal Aviation Administration measured the closest proximity of the two aircraft at .23 nautical miles and 100 feet. "And that is only because these two controllers acted so quickly to pull these airplanes apart," Rinaldi said. "Their actions on that day saved hundreds of lives."

Schile, upon receiving the President's Award with Rice at the Archie League Medal of Safety Awards banquet, described the way he felt immediately after the event and the knowledge of just how close these two aircraft got before they were saved. It's not something any controller wants to experience, his words indicated. "Andy and I are deeply grateful, honored, and completely humbled to receive this recognition," Schile said. "But respectfully, we hope to hell we never receive it again."

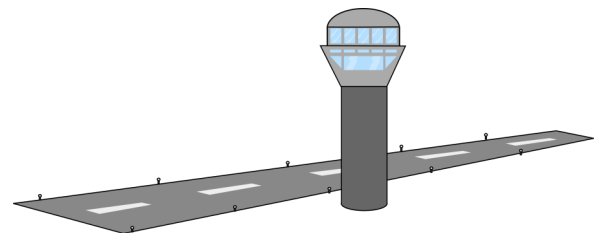

Our members frequently attend the GA users meetings at KPWK and this July meeting our member Rogers Faden was on line. See his report below. We invite you to join us in representing the users of our airport at future meetings of this type.

From Rogers:

I attended and summarized the discussions below:

- There will be no major runway or taxiway projects this year. This means minimal runway closures. There will be crack sealing and painting on taxiways and ramps. Some taxiway markings may be enhanced as the airport is striving to upgrade markings to the standards for Part 139 airports.
- The Customs building construction will start either early fall or early spring. Timing is TBD shortly. Minimal impact on airport operations. There will be some taxiway closures when the pad is connected to the taxiways.
- EMAS repairs are complete.
- Sound testings is starting with about 30 homes. There will be remediation in about 30-40 homes per year moving forward.
- There have been no Covid cases at the airport.
- Hangar 5/6 financial impact is tracking well with the budget for this year.

PAPA SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

With Covid interruptions and school closures, meeting cancellations and the loss of our wonderful summer membership appreciation hangar party, its been a tough year for the scholarship program.

The Illinois institutions of higher learning that train and educate our future aviation professionals were still teaching and grading their hard working students. They responded to our requests for applicants with 19 total submissions. A very good number.

Our mandate and ByLaws allow us to fund scholarships to Illinois residents who are attending an Illinois institution of higher education in any aviation field as full time students. Based on the amount donated during the past year, and calculated per our bylaws, our Officers and Directors read the applications received and judge them carefully. They are qualified as to their residence and their school. The applicants are then judged on the completeness of their submission, the grades acheived, their indication of financial need, their career goals, and their character as stated by letters of recommendation.

Each Board member votes separately and then the votes are compiled and the winners announced. This year we are very pleased to announce the following:

Winner of \$1,000.00 scholarship to continue his pursuit of a degree in aviation flight from Southern Illinois University is Max Dunlavy. Max is from Homewood, IL and has great grades and glowing recommendations. Congratulations, Max.

Winner of a \$500.00 award to continue his education in Aviation Maintenance Management (at Lewis University) and a pilot (at KPWK) is Rushi Dave. Rushi is a full time student at Lewis, and resides in Des Plaines. He has dedication and a genuine need for assistance—his mom lost her job due to the Covid shut down. Rushi works at KORD for UPS and will continue his two-track efforts to excel in aviation.

Winner of a second \$500.00 award is Brett Kovac, also pursuing both maintenance and flight careers. Brett is an adult changing careers, who attends Rock Valley College. Brett's application impressed the judges with its fully fleshed out career path and life goals. We wish the best for Brett in both.

Our scholarship fund was gifted this year with several large donations. Those gifts are so well received—we are very grateful. It is our intent to grow this fund until the awards can be augmented to a great extent by the interest earned on the principal investment. To that end we award only half of what we receive and add the interest. The remaining half is the growth fund.
